An Insight into contemporary Fashion World (8 December, 2012)






Acharya Students Bag Prizes at BU(19, 20 April, 2012)

"MIND SEEK 2011" AT SURANA COLLEGE(20 & 21, December 2011)



The visit was to 'SHRISTI SPECIAL ACADEMY' for children with special needs situated at Chanennahalli. Thirty psychology students accompanied by Mr. George, Head of Psychology department were provided with an excellent opportunity to get in touch with children who were suffering from some of the major developmental disabilities like cerebral palsy, ADHD, autism, mental retardation and Down's syndrome. There was an introductory session about the institute by Mr. Raju, a guide from the institute who gave an explanation to the students about different disorders which was a learning experience to the students. Later Mr. George gave a class to the students about the cases observed and their intellectual levels.

Students were taken to various departments like the primary assessment centre; occupational therapy, physiotherapy and vocational training centre and explained how they functioned for the betterment of the children. Our college students were explained about how these rehabilitation programs would make change in the children with special needs. Some of our students purchased the articles made in the vocational training centre. Later the students collected the data needed for their project. They also interacted with the children and went through their case files which made them to have a better understanding about the children and their conditions. The program ended with a feedback session from the students. The program was really appreciated by the students which were clearly evident in the way students provided the feedback.
