- 7 Describe the architecture characteristics of a centralized Church plan with the help of Hagia Sophia, Istanbul as an example. (20 Marks)

- 8 What are the characteristics features of Romanesque architecture? Explain this with the help of examples. (20 Marks)

- 9 Describe the architectural features of Gothic style and explain it in detail with the help of an example. (20 Marks)

- 10 Explain the architectural features of Chartres cathedral with the help of sketches. (20 Marks)
