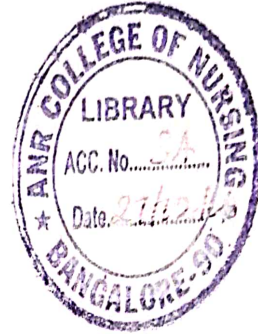

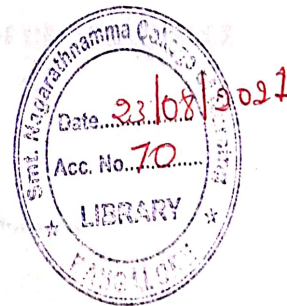
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## ABSTRACT

**Title:** "A DESCRIPTIVE STUDY TO ASSESS THE KNOWLEDGE REGARDING OPPORTUNISTIC INFECTION ON HIV&TB AMONG STAFF NURSES AT SELECTED HEALTH FACILITY BANGALORE."

**Background:**

**Objective**

- To assess the knowledge on opportunistic infection of HIV&TB among staff nurses.

**Method:** Descriptive approach was used to collect data from 30 subjects. Selected by purposive sampling technique through non probability sampling approach consisting 2 sections.

**Section A:** Demographic Performance consisting of 8 items

**Section B:** Structured questionnaire for assessing knowledge level consisting of 30 items

**Result:** Majority 82.5% of respondents had knowledge about TB. 75.61% of respondents were aware of HIV. 67.7% of respondents were aware about opportunistic infections.

**Overall mean percentage of knowledge score is 75.1%.**

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
