







- A 1.5 mt long column has a circular cross section of 50 mm diameter, one end of the column 8 is fixed in direction and position, and other end is free. Taking the FOS as 3, calculate the safe load using,
  - (i) Euler's formula taking  $E = 1.2 \times 10^5 \text{ N/mm}^2$
  - Rankine's formula taking yield stress 560 N/mm<sup>2</sup> and  $a = \frac{1}{1600}$ . (10 Marks) (ii)
